Almaguin Forest Products is a hardwood sawmill and Crown forest licensee which has been operating in South River for over 20 years. In early-2019, the company was acquired by Haliburton Forest & Wildlife Reserve. Following the refurbishment of its sawmill, AFP plans to expand its operations on nearby Crown forest units. To support this growing enterprise, AFP is recruiting a Woodlands Supervisor.

The Woodlands Supervisor will manage annual planning, treemarking, roads work, and timber harvesting. The individual may be involved with other opportunities to support a growing sawmill and forest management operation as they arise. This is an opportunity for a quick-learning and ambitious forestry professional who hopes to become key member of the AFP and Haliburton Forest leadership teams. The Woodlands Supervisor will report to the Sawmill Manager at Almaguin Forest Products and the Forestry Manager at Haliburton Forest.

The Woodlands Supervisor will be responsible for all aspects of forest management, including: selecting blocks for the annual work schedule; planning silvicultural approaches and treemarking; co-ordinating contractors to ensure that road building/harvesting is safe, efficient, and sustainable; and working alongside Crown forest management staff and other Crown forest licensees. The individual will pursue other opportunities related to timber procurement and private land management in the region. The Woodlands Supervisor will enjoy a high level of autonomy with a flexible schedule, with the expectation that they make themselves available to work whenever necessary in order to get the job done.

The Woodlands Supervisor will have the following characteristics: valid class G drivers license, a degree or diploma in forestry or a related field, confidence working in the bush alone and as part of a crew, strong communication skills, the grit and ability to work through inclement weather on challenging terrain, experience with orienteering, a strong comprehension of silviculture in the Great Lakes St. Lawrence forest region, and the ambition to contribute to a growing business like AFP. Experience with treemarking, cruising, access planning, and harvest supervision, and workplace health and safety will be considered an asset, but attitude and ambition are more important than experience or qualifications
