Program Development Component

- Provides technical & strategic OHS support to clients & stakeholders across the industry.
- Development of learning resources on safety issues identified by the industry.
- Researches and sources best practices and world class safety performance methods for application in the forest sector.
- Interfaces with various public sector agencies in establishing learning resources.
- Monitors regulatory changes and conducts impact analyses.
- Writes Monthly Safety Alerts and Fatality Alerts when required.
- Leads the planning and delivery of safety conferences with the assistance of industry committees.
- Attends Industry Advisory Group meetings and manages projects identified by these groups.

Training Component

- Develops new classroom and online courses and revises existing courses, including managing contract development work. Responds to industry requests for new programs.
- Designs and develops instructor and participant manuals for training programs.
- Designs online training resources where appropriate. Participates on the learning management system (LMS) implementation team.
- Participates in department quality assurance program as required.
- Attends and participates in industry events, such as conferences, to promote Council training and programs.
- Interacts regularly with Council staff and stakeholders in response to immediate training issues and concerns.
- Develops and manages work plans and budgets.
