The successful candidate will have knowledge of major factors affecting both forest and agriculture landscapes, basic understanding of the various industrial sectors operating in the province, other land use pressures, and theories and strategies associated with landscape cumulative effects management.

The successful candidate will possess excellent strategic and critical thinking skills as well as excellent written and verbal communication skills. The candidate must have excellent negotiation and facilitation skills, ability to work independently, and work cooperatively with colleagues and others to meet client and ministry goals and objectives. The successful candidate will also provide advice and guidance to a variety of audiences to persuade and build support, to educate, and to promote understanding of complex concepts and issues.

Typically, the knowledge and skills required for this position would be obtained through a postgraduate degree in landscape cumulative effects management, landscape planning, resource management planning or related fields of study, and several years of progressively responsible experience, or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
