Qualifications for this role include:

- Diploma in forest engineering, forest management or equivalent related field, plus three years of experience in a directly operational field forestry activities.

OR

- An equivalent combination of education and experience such as five years of experience in two or more in the following operational field forestry activities
- Operational field forestry activities include the following:
 - Timber harvesting monitoring/conformance
 - Cut-block development
 - Forest road engineering
 - Silviculture
- Applicants must be registered or eligible for registration with the Association of British Columbia Forest Professionals as a Registered Forest Technologist or equivalent.
- Must possess at minimum a valid Class 5 B.C. Driver's License that does not limit or restrict the ability to conduct the duties of the job.
