The positions listed require mainly field-work but effective office work skills are also necessary. Timber Development Staff – Kamloops & Nelson

Timber development staff work within a highly integrated, professional team to provide field-based expertise in developing cutblocks and roads.

Example duties:

- road layout;
- cutblock layout (conventional and cable); timber cruising;
- riparian assessments;
- appraisal information collection;
- GPS traversing;

- timber reconnaissance;
- waste and residue surveys;
- site plan data collection.

The open positions can be filled at a variety of levels. Our present need is primarily at the entry-level (Forestry Assistant) position, but we are also interested in hearing from more experienced individuals. For the Forestry Assistant role, previous timber development experience is preferred but not mandatory; any experience working out in the woods is an asset. For all positions, FPBC registration as a trainee or practicing forest professional is preferred.

Forestry Assistant (0-2 years of experience, FPBC registration preferred) \$200-220/day* Forestry Associate (2-4 years of experience, FPBC registration preferred) \$210-\$250/day* Forestry Supervisor (5+ years of experience, FPBC registration highly preferred) \$240-280/day* * The above rates are based on a 10-hour day / 50-hour work week and factor in overtime.

Silviculture Survey Staff – Kamloops

Silviculture survey staff work within a highly integrated, professional team to provide field-based expertise in silviculture survey implementation and reporting. Previous silviculture survey experience is required. Silviculture Surveyor Accreditation with the BC Ministry of Forests is highly preferred, or willingness to take the accreditation course. Further, FPBC registration as a trainee or practicing forest professional is preferred.

- free-growing surveys.
